Denver's early days of spring started with sunshine but turned dark on March 22, as violence erupted for the second time in as many months by East High School. Only days after East High soccer player, Luis Garcia, was laid to rest - victim of a drive-by shooting near the school on February 13 – two members of the school staff were shot by a student being checked for weapons before being allowed to enter the buildina.

Just hours after the attack, Denver Public Schools Superintendent, Alex Marrero, asked the School Board - and they agreed - to reverse their decision to not have armed police presence in DPS facilities. Through the end of the school year there will be two DPD officers present at East High, and one at all other comprehensive DPS high schools. The situation will be evaluated in concert with individual school leadership moving forward.

We have approximately 340-million people in the United States. A 2020 report from the National Shooting Sports foundation reports some 440-million firearms currently in civilian hands. The National Institute of Mental Health reported in their 2020 study, that nearly one in five U.S. adults live with a mental illness, and our youth are in similar crisis. The impact of the COVID pandemic, along with extremist rhetoric spewing hatred in all directions, has stressed the population even more. This is a social context that does not portend for good outcomes.

Denver has laws outlawing assault weapons, high-volume magazines, bump stocks and ghost guns. We've limited concealed carry in city buildings and parks. And the problem continues. And grows.

Yes, we need to lock up criminals who are likely to strike again. Yes, cops in schools can play a role in this insane time of heightened concern. But we must do far more of a long-term, cause-based strategic approach to return safety to our school campuses and our communities.

Most importantly, we must heighten our focus on housing, mental health, drug treatment and other social determinants of community well-being if we want to have any hope to halt society's march down the violent path we are on. Child care must be readily available and affordable. With many families with two working parents, after-school programming must be plentiful and appropriate for all ages. And with at least equal urgency, we must get very serious about keeping guns out of the hands of those who have no business possessing them. To say guns are the entire problem does not make sense. But to say that the excess of weapons on our streets does not play a role in gun violence is even more non-sensical.

I am committed to addressing both areas as vigorously as possible. We must stop talking about how much we value our youth, and begin demonstrating that importance clearly. The carnage has got to stop.

#### CHANGES TO DENVER COMPOST GUIDELINES

The City and County of Denver, along with other Front Range communities, is working with regional compost manufacturer A1 Organics to create a high-quality, clean finished compost product made from materials generated from City compost collections.

By using food scraps and yard & plant trimmings to create a marketable finished compost, we keep them out of the landfill where they create harmful methane emissions. This compost will help Colorado farms and landscapes build healthy soils that absorb CO2 from the atmosphere, reduce water and chemical use, and grow nutritious foods. 


#### CORY-MERRILL REAL ESTATE: Slow Start to Spring Market

Hello Cory-Merrill! One could say we've had a sluggish start to our spring market. This is well represented by reColorado's most recent market watch report that includes year-over-year data from February. The number of homes closed, the median closed price, new listings and pending listings are all down. Homes are taking longer to sell—the median days in MLS is up 23 days. Weeks of inventory is up. Six weeks of inventory versus two in February of last year. However, we are still inventory starved and it's still technically a seller's market. Homes that are priced right, have an ideal location and a floor plan that makes sense will likely still have more than one offer.

lower interest rates for the first two years of their loan, and then return to the original rate for the remaining term. 
