In my recent e-newsletter, I spoke of the Denver Public Schools newcomer programs that welcome children from other countries who are neither fluent in English or their native tongue, and need special attention to raise them up to a point where they can continue their education and move toward a productive and fulfilling life in the U.S. Three of these programs are housed at schools within Council District 6 – Place Bridge Academy, Cherry Creek North Drive at Quebec St; South High School, 1700 E Louisiana Ave; and your own Merrill Middle School, 1550 S Monroe St. In discussions with the dedicated staff at all three of these excellent facilities, common challenges that face newcomer students arose. While steadying and moving forward with their

education hung at the top of the ladder, difficulties with finding affordable housing, finding convenient and affordable transportation to school, and dealing with the multitude of emotional struggles caused by trauma in their homeland and the challenge of acclimating to life in the U.S. also require continuing and focused attention.

The recent and continuing influx of migrants coming to Denver from our southern border may bring new faces to these DPS programs. As I write this on Dec. 21, the city as a whole is being stretched to the max of its resources to gracefully and compassionately welcome these new families at the same time we are expecting historic cold temperatures for the next 48 hours putting added stress on our shelter system and those living outside.

I spent an hour in Denver's EOC (Emergency Operations Center) yesterday watching and listening to a cadre of representatives from all of Denver's agencies interfacing with each other, as well as partners from around the metro area, in attempts to be sure all our visitors and homeless residents are kept safe. As of yesterday, following an appeal from Mayor Hancock to surrounding jurisdictions, the only County that had come forward to lend a hand, was Larimer County. The good folks of Larimer welcomed about 45 migrants to safety within their borders.

We need to continue to clarify and strengthen our national, state and local policy on immigration, and we need to do the same regarding our efforts to bring the homeless indoors. As I look at the weather warning of negative 18 degrees expected overnight, with possible wind chills to minus 40, I know many, many city staff and volunteers are working hard to see that all of those in our care are kept warm and safe. I pray that is the case.

More Joy, Less Waste in 2023!

In December, a typical household increases their waste by up to 23%. But if you resolved to reduce your footprint this year (and are adjusting to Denver's new FEE FOR TRASH program), here are some tips and tricks to reduce your waste:

- Entertaining? Use this Guestimator tool to minimize food waste when planning to serve a crowd.
- When you stock up on baking ingredients, buy them in glass rather than plastic. The glass you recycle will be turned into new bottles right here in Colorado!
- When you do use plastic, remember:
 - Recycle rigid plastic bottles, jugs, jars, tubs, cups and containers marked #1 through #7 in your purple recycling bin
 - NO Plastic bags Denver's #1 recycling contaminant
 - NO Bubble wrap or Tyvek® envelopes (polyethylene fiber used in some overnight mailing envelopes)
- Out with the old this new year? Remember...
 - Paper goes in the Purple (bin), even: window envelopes, paperclips, stamps, staples, tape, and sticky notes. Just don't recycle those foil-coated holiday cards & envelopes!
 - Denver residents serviced by Solid Waste Management may schedule a FREE appliance collection appointment. Appliance collections are done by the City to ensure that metals are recycled and Freon gases from refrigerated appliances are handled in an environmentally safe manner. To schedule an appliance collection appointment, call 3-1-1 (720-913-1311)
- Recover from the pre-holiday catalog craziness and prevent unsolicited mail in the future by calling the 1-800 number on back covers and asking to be removed from their mailing list. Find more tips on how to reduce junk mail.


