SUMMER GARDENING... ways to win the WAR on weeds!

They're sneaky, those weeds. They start out small, and before you know it, they've taken over your garden beds and lawn.

Although you'll never eliminate all of your weeds, you can control them to some extent by taking the steps below:



1. Chop off their heads. A single dandelion can disperse up to 15,000 seeds. If you tear off the flowers, you'll prevent seeds from forming.

2. Mulch like mad. Mulch prevents weeds, conserves moisture and moderates the soil temperature. How deep? 2 to 3 inches.

3. Don't mow low. Keep your grass 2.5 to 3 inches tall. Taller grass helps shade the ground to prevent weed seeds from germinating.

4. Let sleeping weeds lie. Don't disturb your soil any more than necessary. Otherwise, you'll bring weed seeds to the surface.

5. Pull weeds when wet. It's easiest to pull weeds, after a rainstorm when the ground is soft.

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SOMETIMES...it just doesn't meet code!

If you see something that just "LOOKS WRONG" you don't need to ignore it, just ask **Denver 311**

Have you ever looked at something on the street or in an alley that just didn't look right? Sometimes your best instincts are correct and what you see does not meet Denver's City Codes. Help make sure these issues are handled from the start...when you first see it! It only takes a quick call to Denver's 311. They can check into your question and, in most cases, the City Inspectors will take it from there.

Real estate signs

No zoning permit is required for real estate signs. However, the display of real estate signs on your property must follow the zoning regulations. See Article I 0 of the Denver Zoning Code. Real estate signs must be placed on private property. No signs may be placed in the public right-of-way. This includes tree lawn, median strips, highway entrance and exit ramps, traffic signs and posts, as well as utility poles.

Must be at least 3 feet back from the sidewalk

Are **<u>limited to one per street frontage</u>**. For an interior lot, only one sign is allowed, and for corner lot, only one sign facing each street is allowed. Cannot be illuminated or animated. Are limited to wall, window, or ground signs.

A few years ago, Cory Merrill and Stokes Place/ Green Bower NA's took a real estate agent to court for SHORT TERM RENTING in our respective neighborhoods. He lost. In essence, IT IS AGAINST DENVER ORDINANCES. There can be no renting for less than 30 days. In our neighborhood, short term rentals are a destructive influence. It may very well have a an undesired effect on our property values, our quiet solitude and the safety of our children just to name a few. Council person Mary Beth Susman has a new name for short term rental, Sharing Economy or Collaborative Consumption is her catch phrase, it still means the same. She is introducing this to the Denver City Council to study the new "sharing economy" and understand how it will affect our future. This meeting will have been completed on May 12, prior to this newsletter. I have spoken with Council Person Charlie Brown on this matter and the issues from a few years ago. * * * **REAL ESTATE UPDATE** * * * DENVER, DALLAS SET POST-CRISIS HIGHS




The cold weather and the late snow kept the Denver housing market moving at a slow pace at the start of the year, but as always, the onset of spring has brought flowers and real estate signs to the front yards of the Mile High City.

Case-Shiller just released it's March report and it shows that both the Denver and Dallas real estate markets have set new post-crisis highs, ranking it 15th of the 20 metro statistical areas tracked by the company. CoreLogic, another real estate data company that owns Case-Shiller but issues it's own report, states that Denver was one of eight states that "surpassed their previous home peaks" suggesting that Denver is bucking the national trend of possible growth slowing. CoreLogic says that Denver showed a 10.5 percent increase in April 2014, down 16 percent from April 2013. The strongest area of growth was seen in Redfins 2014 Luxury Report indicating that sales of the priciest 1 percent of homes is up 21.1 percent so far this year with 44.7 percent of the buyers in that market paying for their home purchase in cash.

Cory-Merrill is firmly positioned within this sector of highly desirable communities.

Cory Merrill continues to be a neighborhood with a particular high rate of sales and there seems to be no end to the flow of buyers who actively seek out home ownership in this sought after community. With the summer market just getting started this continues to be a Seller's market. Seller's who seek to take advantage are seeing more competition then existed two months ago, however, the Cory-Merrill neighborhood continues to see high appreciation and bidding wars.

They serve NOVO coffee and Teatulia Organic tea. Starting the beginning of June you'll find patio seating at Sweet As Pie, located on the corner of Louisiana and South Clayton!
